Unused medications are a disaster waiting to be found, so it's vital to safely dispose of unneeded and expired prescriptions. You should never flush or drain your unused prescription medications. There are safe Drug Take Back disposal sites available throughout the State of Florida, and all sites offer confidential disposal.



How and Where to Dispose of Unwanted Prescription Painkillers and Other Drugs

-  **Local Police Departments** - If your prescriptions contain narcotics or other controlled substances, contact your local police department to find out if the police will accept them.
-  **Drug Take Back Day - Don't Be The Dealer** – Lost, stolen and misused prescription drugs contribute to the opioid epidemic. Whenever possible, clean out and take back your unused and expired prescription drugs to a collection program or event.
-  **IMPORTANT! Drug Take Back is confidential** - You may place your unused prescriptions into a plastic zipper lock bag, or remove the prescription label from the outside of the bottle.
